Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for Parent Pre-Baptismal Instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Education Office.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Education Office. To request a visitation for Holy Communion to the Sick, contact our parish office.

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). Adults seeking Confirmation should contact our Religious Education Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, which is administered by a Priest, a person or an immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day.

THE STAINED GLASS WIN-DOWS OF HOLY CROSS AND IMMACULATE CONCEPTION— PART II

The Baptism of the Lord. (Immaculate Conception)

This beautiful stained-glass window, sits behind the baptistry area of Immaculate Conception Church. The image is based on the Gospel of St. Mark (1:9-11), wherein Jesus, who had no need of Baptism, made the waters of Baptism holy, by submitting himself to Baptism by St. John the Baptist. Ultimately, from the



Blood and Water that flowed from Christ's side as he lay dying on the Cross, Baptism would take on a new and more powerful salvific meaning. This is prefigured in this window, as Saint John the Baptist is holding a staff the looks like a cross. Likewise, presence of God's Holy Spirit – which is imbued on us in Baptism – is shown in the form of a Dove. The scripture of this event reads: "It happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.'"



St. Joseph Foster-Father of the Lord. (Holy Cross) St. Joseph is shown often with a carpenter's tool at his left (representing his being a carpenter by trade), and a lily (fleur de lis) in his right hand. The imagery of the lily comes from Sacred Tradition and connected to Joseph's marriage to Mary. When Mary was of age to Mary, the local men who would want to seek her hand in marriage came to the Temple and were asked to place a stick on the

altar (which would likely be used later for offering up animal sacrifices) to make their intention known. When Joseph placed down his stick, a lily immediately blossomed from it, thus, showing God's blessing on Joseph in his intention marry Mary.

The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. (Immaculate Conception)

This stained-glass image is not based directly on the Scriptures, but rather on the ancient text, The Protoevangelium of St. James. It shows Ss. Joachim and Ann (Mary's parents, both haloed designating their saintly status), presenting their young



daughter Mary (also bearing a halo) to the service of the Temple, at which the time the Priest (on the right of the image) imparts his blessing on her. The text on which this image is based reads as follows: "And the child was three years old, and... they went up into the temple of the Lord. And the priest received her, and kissed her, and blessed her, saying: 'The Lord has magnified your name in all generations. In you, on the last of the days, the Lord will manifest His redemption to the sons of Israel.' And he set her down upon the third step of the altar, and the Lord God sent grace upon her; and she danced with her feet, and all the house of Israel loved her... And Mary was in the temple of the Lord as if she were a dove that dwelt there, and she received food from the hand of an angel."



St. Helena. (Holy Cross) St. Helena was the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, who was the Emperor who legalized Christianity in the Roman Empire, and who converted to the faith on his deathbed, bringing an effective end to supremacy of the old pagan religions of Rome. St. Helena is almost always shown wearing a crown, because she was connected to the Imperial Crown of Rome and is almost always shown holding or carrying a cross. Why? Be-

cause St. Helena was a Christian, and with her son's consent went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to uncover the true Cross of Christ which had been buried there to protect it from the formerly-pagan forces of the Empire. And she did find it, along with the two other crosses (of the bad thief and the good thief) crucified along with Christ. To identify which cross was Christ's, St. Helena touched each cross to the body of sick man – the touching by the first crosses did nothing, but when touched with the third cross, the man was healed. The true cross was then venerated, and St. Helena ordered that the Church of the Holy Sepluchre be built on that site – and it was.

Chance G. was the voiceover. The subject was the funds raised by the HSA that had been earmarked for the purchase of new Reading textbooks for the elementary school. The new Wonders Reading series published by McGraw-Hill was being purchased for us through the generous funds raised by the HSA through the year.

Before I launch into the purpose and content of the HSA meeting held on September 23rd, may I take the opportunity to clarify one point? I have stated that funds were raised by the HSA. In fact that is true. Last school year the ladies worked indefatigably to muster up the needed funds for the purchase of our new Reading series. However, those funds were raised due to the generosity and widespread response to fundraisers held here by the school and planned by the HSA. Below I will list the highpoints of the presentation made to those gathered on the evening of the 23rd. At the conclusion, I will discuss the details of the new approach being taken this year to raise funds for the school in an effort to further enhance curriculum and student life here at Holy

Fundraisers are designed and held to be just that; to raise monies for a designated purpose.

Historically, a discussion has always occurred between administration and the HSA Board to determine a right course for the expenditure of funds.

Over the past few years, the HCS community has raised over \$100,000! As a result of these fine efforts, and concern for our students, the following innovations have occurred.

- 8 Carts of Chromebooks
- Evidence-Based Computer Program to Enhance Vocabulary Skills
- Upgraded Campus-Wide Security System
- State-of-the-Art Literacy Program

The following is a summary of the efforts of last years' fundraising efforts.

- Our most profitable fundraisers this past year were the Crusader Walkathon and Fall Fest. Together, these two major fundraisers raised over \$29,000.
- Four fundraisers (Coupon Books, Penny Drive, the Box Top Rally, and the Used Clothing Drive) each raised over \$1,000.
- Smaller fundraising events, such as Chick-Fil-A Spirit Nights, Skate Night, and the Chuck-E-Cheese Play Date, collectively raised \$1,170.

In total, 2018-2019 HCS fundraisers earned \$40,716.41 for our school.

Non-Fundraiser Events: not intended to raise a significant sum of money for HCS. Main goal is to provide memorable events for parents and children.

- Mother-Son Dance
- Father-Daughter Dance

- Father-Son Camping Trip

It was in response to the price attached to the ticket, the seemingly constant outreach to the parent community to buy, sponsor, or donate that prompted both administration and HSA to at least hold a discussion of the possibility to bring about change. As always, change is often seen as revolutionary. So it was with a degree of caution and trepidation that these discussions were held with Mr. Kenneth Trojan, our Business Manager as well as with our Pastor, Father Lentini. It was almost immediately that we received their endorsement for instituting a change in the approach to fundraising here at Holy Cross.

As opposed to holding the traditional fundraisers, a new and fresh approach is being taken. Details for that change are bulleted below:

Each family is requested to pay a nominal fee of \$100.00 per child in an effort to "raise funds" for further enhancement such endeavors as the Reading curriculum in junior high and other areas of the school community.

Given the enrollment of the school, this will allow us to raise a sum of nearly \$40,000 without the constant request for you to buy, donate, or sponsor.

It is of great importance to note that the Parent-Child events WILL STILL BE HELD!! But, with the exception of the F/S Camping Trip, they will all take place in our beautiful Parish Hall. There will be a 90% reduction in cost for the ticket making it all of \$10.00, plus \$5.00 for any additional child. No sacrifices will be made in insuring a festive good time. AND, we will still have the great Secret Santa Shop, the fun of Trunk or Treat Night, our spirit nights at Chick Fil-A and Skate Night along with an end of the year celebratory Walk-A-Thon. Student life and community spirit is not being sacrificed, but rather being seen as a priority for this years' Board.

Fundraisers are a necessary evil. It is our hope that this approach will take the sting out of the overall process.

My sincerest thanks go to both Mrs. Southard and Mrs. Vincent for their vision for the future of PAGE 9 fundraising here at HCS.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend is one of note for college-bound seniors: the SAT Exam takes place on October 5. This particular test is THE one which a majority of senior students will take advantage of in order to solidify their best



scores for submission in admissions applications. It's a nerve-wracking experience for even the most well-prepared!

The seniors at STMA are not the only ones to face the rigor of standardized testing this month, however. At STMA, the PSAT, geared toward sophomores and juniors, is administered to ALL STMA underclassmen. As a college preparatory school, we feel strongly that 9th-11th graders should be exposed to the exam and given guidance on testing strategies in addition to the training they get on content included in our curriculum. Students are given the opportunity to understand their score results and use the help of instructors and tutors to develop the areas of weakness and build on areas of strength that PSAT results might highlight.

As anxiety-inducing as such exams can be, I remain unconcerned for the Ravens. I have learned to have great faith in our students' abilities to rise to the challenge of national, standardized exams, and great faith in the support they'll receive from our instructors. My faith is based on the measurable results we repeatedly see. The students of STMA consistently outscore the state and national averages for the SAT.

This is not an on-again, off-again phenomena, nor is it a statistic from long ago in our school's history to which we cling for good marketing buzz. The STMA Class of 2019 had an average score that was 142 points higher than the state of Delaware average!

Did you hear the news that last year's STMA Valedictorian, Jessica Zhang, also a graduate of Holy Cross School, earned recognition as a National Merit Scholarship Commended Student? What does this mean? Commended Students placed among the top 50,000 scorers of more than 1.6 million students based on the 2017 PSAT exam, which Jessica took as a junior student. Jessica is not the only Raven to be acknowledged by the NMSQT organization!

I am quick to remind our nervous students of these trends and the success of their peers whenever they fret over exam preparedness.

In case you're wondering, Jessica now studies at the University of Michigan, recognized as one of the top five US public universities.

Sometimes families take the information presented above and imagine that our school only serves the students at the top of their class with a laser-focus on attending a prestigious university. They mistakenly think our school isn't interested in serving the "average Joe." Don't forget that the scores I've summarized reflect our (literal) average Joes, not just our top students; our goal is to help ALL of our students to maximize their potential and chart the best path forward for them – not the path we deem to be most prestigious or best for our own reputation. We take great care to advise students to develop their unique God-given gifts so that they may be wellrounded citizens who better the colleges and universities that prove to be a best fit for them.

We define success in Catholic terms.

Small class sizes and small student to teacher ratios help ensure all enrolled receive individual attention and guidance. Because our students are known, they can be challenged. As they are challenged, they may grow. As they grow and find success, they develop an appetite to continue their journeys of personal growth. When they fail- as all of us do- they have a support network to encourage them to keep trying. And, slowly, methodically, the Ravens become students ready to face the challenges not just of college, but of life, eager for more success and opportunities to share that success with those who come after them. We're proud of every Raven, and we are proud to set our bar for success high.
