The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process in which adults and children of catechetical age join the Catholic Church. Please contact Deacon Sherman Mitchell III, our R.C.I.A. Coordinator, for details at 302-492-0753.

Parents wishing to present their children for **Infant Baptism** must participate in an orientation session. Please call the parish office at 410-482-8939 for details.

Please contact Alicia Poppiti at 410-482-8939 about the preparation of young people for **Confirmation**, or about children's first reception of the Sacraments of **Reconciliation** and the **Eucharist**.

Couples planning **Matrimony** meet with the Pastor or one of the Deacons at least one year in advance of the wedding date they are considering. Please call the parish office to arrange for this meeting.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: The **Anointing of the Sick** is appropriate for anyone faced with hospitalization or a serious challenge to health. When a hospital admission is planned, please arrange to receive the Anointing here beforehand, if at all possible. Our lay ministers to the sick bring **Holy Communion** to those unable to come to Mass for any length of time. Please call the parish office to arrange for these services.

Your Pastor, Deacons and parish staff members are always happy to speak in confidence with anyone who senses a call to **ordained ministry** or **religious life**.

Dear Parishioners,

If you have ever been really ill, you know how bad that feels. But, on that first day when you know what you had passed, and you are back to health and feeling good again, you get a small taste of resurrection. The Season of Easter, which begins today on Easter Sunday, gives us a full taste and a full understanding of what a true, actual Resurrection – the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ – means for us! This is Easter! This is the day around which the Church year is built. And if you want to know why, read on!

Apple's Terms and Conditions. Easter's significance beckons us back to Adam and Eve. They committed that original, prideful sin of disobedience by eating the fruit (traditionally identified as an apple) from the one tree from which they were forbidden by God to eat. That was the original sin that put a gaping wound in the

relationship between God and man. Thus, mankind lost paradise and its perfect relationship with God. Over time God tried to set things right by way of covenants, by the sacrificial system, etc. But all of those instituted agreements relied on fallible man also abiding by them. Breaking news: Mankind did not. Man's side of the covenants always wound up unfulfilled. In the fullness of time, God sent his only Son into the world as its Messiah – a messiah both to the Jewish people and to the world. This Messiah, Jesus Christ, ultimately instituted a new and everlasting covenant in his blood. Christ was the incarnation of God in the world and He showed us how to live and exist as God would want. He was faithful to his mission of salvation – even to the point of death.

Amidst this scenario, Christ made a Covenant in which he represented both the human and the Divine side of it. This Covenant would be sealed in his blood; thus, his

sacrifice was the perfect one in which he was the offerer (priest) and the offering (victim). His sacrifice was so perfect that all of man's past deeds and deeds yet-to-come could be forgiven, and his place in creation could be restored.

Rising Up the Charts. Let's jump forward in time for a minute: In 1979, band leader Herb Albert (of Tijuana Brass fame), who had been a superstar in the 60s, came back to life on the music charts with the appropriately titled "Rise." This instrumental hit, "Rise," served to resurrect his career, and brought the same guy back to the music scene, but with a new rhythmic Latin/disco sound, he was also different than before. Bearing in mind this reference from my pop music Pez Dispenser, I want to correlate this "Rise" moment to the Resurrection moment. So, what was a sign that the new and everlasting covenant came into force with its desired effect? Simply put, it was Christ's Resurrection, his rising. Yes, Jesus Christ was risen from the dead, but this was not merely some resuscitation event; it was much more. After Christ's Resurrection, Jesus was the same person as he was before his Passion, but his body had now been glorified. He is the same Christ, but now back with us, and for us, in a different glorified manner.

Easter Presence. The resurrected Christ continues to be present to his people even today, and until the end of time, in the Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist. He is raised and present to us in that Sacrament just as he was to his disciples back in the first century. In the wake of His Resurrection, Christ showed himself to many of his followers, after which he would ascend to Heaven and sent forth his Spirit into the Church so that it might continue to preach His message of hope and redemption to the world.

And so, it goes, that on Easter and in the Easter Season, we remind ourselves and the world that Christ's has opened the gates of heaven to mankind once again and restored the ability of mankind to again have the hope of final rest in heaven. God's promise that he would abide with his people was lived out in Christ's death and Resurrection – and on that first Easter morning mankind became a new creation, a redeemed people. And that is reason to celebrate.

On behalf of the Priests, Deacons and Staff of Holy Cross and Immaculate Conception Parishes, I wish you and your family a joyful and happy Easter Sunday and Easter Season!

If you normally just come to Mass at Christmas and Easter (and perhaps Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday), make today the day you change that. Please make a point of coming to join us in worshipping our Lord every Sunday of the year. We would love to have you! We welcome you! Our two parishes (Holy Cross in Dover, and Immaculate Conception in Marydel) are vibrant beacons of the faith in the center of Delmarva with much to offer.

Our Sacramental life is the center of our parish; we have a vast Mass schedule between our two parishes, allowing the faithful to be nourished by the Word of God and the Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Our newly baptized, newly confirmed and new first communicants number in the hundreds annually. We provide anointing for the sick. We offer confession to restore a person's relationship with the Lord. We provide the Rite of Marriage to many couples annually. We promote vocations to the Priesthood, Diaconate and Religious Life. Both parishes have their doors open all day, every day until evening (okay, true confession, on Christmas and Easter we do lock up a little earlier!). And Holy Cross, specifically offers a dedicated opened-daily 6am-9pm Adoration Chapel.

Additionally: We offer quality Pre-K to 12 Catholic Education at our Parish Elementary School (in Dover) and our Parish High School (in Magnolia). We offer religious education for children, and adults. We offer Youth Ministry and Young Adult ministry program. We have one of largest Hispanic ministry programs in the Diocese. We have various community activities. We have outreach programs (like St. Vincent de Paul Society and our Food Pantry). We have fraternal and spiritual groups like the Knights of Columbus and the Sodality of the Blessed Virgin Mary. And so much more. Today Christ rose from the dead to give you a new life of grace and the hope of heaven; I commend you live that life to its fullest in the context of your Catholic faith by becoming a regular worshipper here at our Parish. Make God happy, become an active part of his flock at our Parish!

COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO PADRE JAMES LENTINI 1 DE ABRIL, 2018.

Queridos feligreses,

Si alguna vez has estado realmente enfermo, sabes lo mal que se siente. Pero, en ese primer día cuando sabes que lo que tienes ya pasó, y recuperas la salud y te sientes bien de nuevo, obtienes un pequeño sabor de la resurrección. El Tiempo de Pascua, que comienza hoy en el Domingo de Pascua, nos da un gusto pleno y una comprensión completa de lo que significa para nosotros una Resurrección verdadera y real de la Resurrección de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Esto es Pascua!

Este es el día en que se construye el año de la Iglesia. Y si quieres saber por qué, ¡sigue leyendo!

Términos y condiciones de Apple. El significado de la Pascua nos hace volver a Adán y Eva. Cometieron ese pecado original y la soberbia de la desobediencia al comer la fruta (tradicionalmente identificada como una manzana) del único árbol del que Dios les prohibió comer. Ese fue el pecado original que puso una herida abierta en la relación entre Dios y el hombre. Por lo tanto, la humanidad perdió el paraíso y su relación perfecta con Dios. Con el tiempo, Dios trató de arreglar las cosas mediante Alianzas, mediante el sistema de sacrificios, etc. Pero todos esos acuerdos instituidos dependerían del hombre falible que también los respetara. Últimas noticias: La humanidad no lo hizo. Por el lado del hombre las alianzas siempre terminaban sin cumplirse. En la plenitud de los tiempos, Dios envió a su único Hijo al mundo como su Mesías, un mesías tanto para el pueblo judío como para el mundo. Este Mesías, Jesucristo, finalmente instituyó una nueva y eterna Alianza en su sangre. Cristo fue la encarnación de Dios en el mundo y nos mostró cómo vivir y existir como Dios quisiera. Fue fiel a su misión de salvación, incluso hasta la muerte. En medio de este escenario, Cristo hizo una Alianza en el que representaba tanto el lado humano como el Divino. Esta Alianza estaría sellado en su sangre; por lo tanto, su sacrificio fue el sacrificio perfecto en el que fue el quien se ofrece (sacerdote) y la ofrenda (víctima). Su sacrificio fue tan perfecto que todos los hechos y las acciones pasadas del hombre podrían ser perdonados, y su lugar en la creación podría ser restaurado.

Subiendo las Carteleras. Pongamos el dial del tiempo por un minuto: en el año 1979, el líder Herb Albert de la banda (de Tijuana Brass fame), que había sido una superestrella en los años 60, volvió a la vida en las listas musicales con el título apropiado "Rise". Este hit instrumental, "Rise", sirvió para resucitar su carrera, y trajo nuevamente al mismo chico a la escena musical, pero con un nuevo sonido rítmico latino / disco, también fue diferente que antes. Teniendo en cuenta esta referencia de mi repertorio de música Pop, quiero relacionar este momento de "Rise" con el momento de la Resurrección. Entonces, ¿qué fue una señal de que la nueva y eterna Alianza entró en vigor con el efecto deseado? En pocas palabras, fue la Resurrección de Cristo, su Ascensión. Sí, Jesucristo resucitó de entre los muertos, pero esto no fue simplemente un evento de resucitación; fue mucho más. Después de la Resurrección de Cristo, Jesús era la misma persona que era antes de su Pasión, pero su cuerpo ahora había sido glorificado. Él es el mismo Cristo, pero ahora vuelve con nosotros, y para nosotros, de una manera glorificada totalmente diferente.

Presencia de Pascua. El Cristo resucitado continúa estando presente en su pueblo incluso hoy, y hasta el final de los tiempos, en el Santísimo Sacramento, la Sagrada Eucaristía.

Él está vivo y presente para nosotros en ese Sacramento tal como lo fue para sus discípulos en el primer siglo. Después de Su Resurrección, Cristo se mostró a muchos de sus seguidores, después ascendió al cielo y envió su Espíritu a la Iglesia para que pudiera continuar predicando su mensaje de esperanza y redención al mundo.

Y así, en Pascua y en el Tiempo Pascual, recordamos a nosotros mismos y al mundo entero que Cristo ha abierto las puertas del cielo a la humanidad una vez más y ha restaurado la capacidad de la humanidad para tener nuevamente la esperanza del descanso final en el cielo. La promesa de Dios de que él permanecería con su pueblo se vivió en la muerte y resurrección de Cristo, y en esa primera mañana de Pascua, la humanidad se convirtió en una nueva creación, un pueblo redimido. Y esa es una razón para celebrar.

Promovemos las vocaciones al sacerdocio, el diaconado y la vida religiosa. Ambas parroquias tienen sus puertas abiertas todo el día, todos los días hasta la noche (de acuerdo, verdadera confesión, en Navidad y Pascua, ¡nos encerramos un poco antes!). Y Holy Cross, específicamente, ofrece una dedicada Capilla de Adoración abierta todos los días de 6 a.m. a 9 p.m. Además: ofrecemos Educación Católica de calidad de Pre-K a 12 en nuestra Escuela Primaria Parroquial (en Dover) y nuestra Escuela Secundaria Parroquial (en Magnolia). Ofrecemos educación religiosa para niños y adultos. Ofrecemos el programa de Ministerio de Jóvenes y Jóvenes Adultos. Tenemos uno de los más grandes programas de ministerio hispano en la Diócesis. Tenemos varias actividades comunitarias. Tenemos programas de extensión (como la Sociedad de San Vicente de Paúl y nuestra Despensa de Alimentos). Tenemos grupos fraternales y espirituales como los Caballeros de Colón y la Congregación de la Santísima Virgen María. Y mucho más. Hoy Cristo resucitó de entre los muertos para darte una nueva vida de gracia y la esperanza del cielo; Te invito a que vivas esa vida al máximo en el contexto de su fe católica al convertirte en un feligrés regular aquí en nuestra Parroquia. ¡Haga feliz a Dios, conviértase en una parte activa de su rebaño en nuestra Parroquia!

The History of Immaculate Conception Parish – 100 Years

In 1929, Fr. Edward F. Glacy, SSJ from Clayton Delaware, began administering to the growing needs of Immaculate Conception Parish. He celebrated Mass, administered the Sacraments and took the first census of the parish by visiting each and every household in the area. He had no duties at Clayton and was able to devote much of his time to the census taking task. There was only one hard surfaced road between Clayton and Marydel at that time, all other roads were dirt and at times not easily traveled. Fr. Glacy, Fr. Hugh Duffy, SSJ, and Fr. Francis J. Tobin, SSJ served the growing flock in the area.

In 1933, Fr. F. Neifert, SSJ became the last Josephite to serve in any official capacity in the parish. He continued to serve for three years.

In the seventeen years laboring in Immaculate Conception parish, the Josephite Fathers accounted for 156 Baptisms, 110 Confirmations, and 7 Deaths.

In 1936, Fr. Edward M. Leinheiser, a Diocesan Priest, was appointed as Chaplain for the Benedictine Convent and Mother House in Ridgely, Maryland. Fr. Leinheiser became the first Priest in Charge of the Immaculate Conception Parish. He is said to have visited each and every household taking the second census of Immaculate Conception Mission Parish. This census took seven years to complete. Fr. Leinheiser knew every dirt road in his parish like the back of his hand. This Mission Parish of Immaculate Conception officially became The Parish of the Immaculate Conception in Marydel, Maryland and was detached from the Josephites in Clayton Delaware.

Join Us in Celebrating 100 YEARS

The History of Immaculate Conception Parish – 100 Years



En 1929, el p. Edward F. Glacy, SSJ de Clayton Delaware, comenzó a atender las crecientes necesidades de la Parroquia de la Inmaculada Concepción. Celebró Misas, administró los Sacramentos y realizó el primer censo de la parroquia visitando todos y cada uno de las casas del área. No tenía responsabilidades en Clayton y pudo dedicar gran parte de su tiempo a la tarea de tomar censos. En ese momento, solo había una carretera de superficie dura entre Clayton y Marydel, todas las demás carreteras estaban sucias y, a veces, no se podía transitar con facilidad. P. Glacy, Fr. Hugh Duffy, SSJ, y el padre. Francis J. Tobin, SSJ sirvieron al creciente rebaño en el área.

En 1933, el p. F. Neifert, SSJ se convirtió en el último Josefita en servir en cualquier capacidad oficial en la parroquia. Él continuó sirviendo por tres años.

En los diecisiete años que trabajaron los Padres Josefita en la parroquia de la Inmaculada Concepción, hubieron 156 Bautismos, 110 Confirmaciones y 7 Muertes.

En 1936, el p. Edward M. Leinheiser, un sacerdote diocesano, fue nombrado capellán del convento benedictino y la casa madre en Ridgely, Maryland. P.
