

Dear Parishioners,

Well, here we are coming to the end of the first month of our New Year! This month of January has played host to a cornucopia of wonderful saints, some of whom are among your Pastor's favorites. Of note, the last week of January really had and really has some notable saints. Moreover, it is no surprise that the tail-end of January and beginning of February always plays host to Catholic Schools Week (this year January 28 - February 3) — as so many of the saints at the tail end of January are connected to Catholic education:

- There is St. Francis de Sales (Jan. 24) whose teachings forms the basis for the Oblates (priests) of St. Francis de Sales — who are a teaching order of Priests and Brothers who run many schools including our own Salesianum School in Wilmington.
- There is St. Angela Merici (Jan. 27) who founded the teacher order of nuns called the Ursulines, who run many schools including Wilmington's Ursuline Academy.
- There is St. Thomas Aquinas (Jan. 28), the greatest thinker and theologian of the Catholic faith, who is the Patron Saint of Catholic Schools and students.
- There is St. John Bosco (Jan. 31) who founded two religious orders (the Salesians and the Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians) to educate boys and girls, respectively. He is the Patron Saint of Young People.

In any event, the saints of this last week of January run the gamut from a converted persecutor of Christians to an outgoing minister to young people. In case you missed some of these saints in the past few days: Fear not, I bring you a recap of some of the highlights from the past few days, and the remaining ones that are upon us now. So, without further ado, I present to you some of the very intriguing saints of the last week of January:

January 24 – St. Francis de Sales, Priest. "*Be who you are, and be that well*" said St. Francis de Sales, a Bishop and a Doctor of the Church. The wisdom of St. Francis de Sales, a well-educated Frenchman who started out in law, but heeded God's call to him to "leave all and follow Me," has spoken to the hearts of many people. St. Francis de Sales served as a holy Priest and Bishop. However, his simple, gentle and clear explanations of the Catholic faith won back many souls; it is said he converted some 40,000 people. His simplicity, gentleness and clarity marked who St. Francis de Sales was – it's who he was, and he was that well. St. Francis de Sales aimed his writings at lay people; he promulgated a spirituality for everyday life – and won many souls for Christ in doing so. By way of the kind manner in which he evangelized, preached and taught, he lived out one of his own sayings: "A spoonful of honey attracts more flies than a barrelful of vinegar." His vast amount of words, wisdom and writings (notably "Introduction to the Devout Life" and "A Treatise on the Love of God") gained him the title of Doctor of the Church. He is the Patron Saint of the Diocese of Wilmington. The Oblates of St. Francis de Sales, who run our Salesianum School and St. Anthony's Parish (both in Wilmington) take St. Francis de Sales as their patron. De Sales died in 1622; his heart is preserved in Venice, Italy, for veneration. It can be aptly said that while his heart may rest in Venice now, in life and in death, it was never far from Christ.

January 25 – Conversion of St. Paul. In the late 1970s and early 1980s, the world was faced with a dilemma: Two companies generated two videotape formats for watching movies with a videotape player. The two competitors: VHS and Betamax. And in those days, you were on one team or another. As the year past, and as Betamax joined the Edsel on the trash heap of history, some folks wouldn't let it go. They defended Betamax to the bitter end and couldn't make that leap of faith. Conversion is hard, and sometimes radical. It requires admitting that "I was wrong." St. Paul is a good example of conversion. Originally named Saul, he believed in God, but hated Christianity (and its practitioners, who he would arrest and persecute). One day on his way to Damascus, where he was going to nab some more of those darn Christians, Saul had a miraculous encounter with our Lord who made himself present to him. That encounter with Christ changed Saul to Paul, but more importantly it changed how he looked at the world and looked at God. It brought him from being a persecutor of Christ and his followers, to being a follower himself, who would later be persecuted. The world didn't change, people didn't change and God certainly didn't change - but Paul did. He had a conversion experience. He understood the world differently. It is his change of heart; his conversion, that we celebrate on January 25. (And if there are still any Betamax defenders out there, January 25 might be a good day to, please, just let it go).

January 27 – St. Angela Merici, Virgin. Remember the rock band Pink Floyd – well, there was no one in that band named "Pink" or "Floyd." So, how did it get its name? The band got its name from two blues musicians who band mem-

We are down to the veritable wire here. Since September HCS has engaged in the open enrollment process. Yes, while it is indeed true that we offer incentives with a built-in graduated application fee, the real reason behind the early re-enrollment process is because the time-frame for the online financial aid application closes on January 31, 2024. Believe me when I say that this is a hard and fast date. Absolutely no one will be granted the favor of an extension. Absolutely no one. We are down to the veritable wire here.

I share this information which comes out of the Diocesan Development Office with you as it was shared with me:

- Each year through its Vision for the Future Education Trust, the diocese offers financial aid to a number of families who desire a Catholic education for their children but who cannot afford the full cost of tuition. Families with children in grades K-12 registered in an inter-parochial or diocesan parish school who believe they are in need of assistance are encouraged to apply.
- To be considered, parents must first submit an application to FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment for evaluation. Please note that it is the policy of the diocese that tuition assistance will be granted to only those families whose children are officially registered in one of our schools. For this reason, enrollment must be official before tuition assistance can be offered.
- It is imperative parents understand that applications and all required documentation must be received by FACTS no later than January 31, 2024. There will be no exception to the deadline. Tuition assistance through the Diocese of Wilmington is provided to children attending grades K-12.
- Families currently receiving tuition assistance from the diocese must reapply for 2024-2025 consideration. Assistance is not automatically renewed from year to year.
- Also, the diocese will not consider incomplete applications.
- *WE ARE ACCEPTING 2022 W-2s. YOU DO NOT NEED TO WAIT FOR 2023 W-2s.

All families are encouraged to apply for Tuition Assistance even if you don't feel it is needed right now. The reason being that in the future event of a change in the financial status of a family, the application is in place and inquiries can be made.

There is no shame in asking. There is no reason to be embarrassed. All information is kept confidential with FACTS and the Diocese. Our Tuition Office is sent the results so they can see if Holy Cross can assist a family whom the Diocese is not able to assist. No one else knows who applies for Financial Assistance. With the perpetual rise in the cost of living, it is an unfortunate truth that oftentimes budgeting and sacrificing for a Catholic school education does not fall very high on the list of needs. This is why Bishop Koenig encourages all parishioners to make a contribution to the Share in the Spirit campaign. Those funds are for the sole purpose of providing tuition assistance **for families who apply.**

Over the years I have known of many families who have been granted financial assistance, who reapply each year, and have been able to provide their children with a Catholic education for nine years. Qualifying families with multiple children receive assistance for each child. Even a little bit helps.

January 31 is right around the corner. Do this for your children. Do it now.

bers admired: Pink Anderson and Floyd Council. St. Angela Merici pulled off a similar naming event. You see, in the 16th century, St. Angela saw that there was a dire need to provide education to young girls. And so, she and several Third Order Franciscan women formed a religious community to take on this mission, and they called themselves the Company of St. Ursula (and after the death of St. Angela, became known as the Ursulines). Now, you may ask, why are they called Ursulines? Was there an Ursula in the group of founders? Nope! St. Angela named the group for St. Ursula, a Virgin-Martyr, who was commonly invoked in that era as the Patron Saint of education. And so as Pink Floyd honored two blues musicians with their name, St. Angela Merici did homage to St. Ursula by naming what would later become a full-fledged religious order after her. The Ursulines are still active today, and in our Diocese, they operate the Ursuline Academy in Wilmington.

January 28 – St Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the Church. Ironic nicknames are always entertaining: The tall guy nicknamed Shorty, a bald guy nicknamed Curly, and the biggest and strongest of Robin Hood's Merry Men, nicknamed Little John. Similarly, St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the greatest theological writers and thinkers in history, was a member of the club of folks with ironic nicknames. You see, when St. Thomas Aquinas joined the Dominicans and began his studies he was very quiet. As a matter of fact as a student he was so very quiet that his classmates assumed him not too bright and dubbed him a "dumb ox." And that name stuck. His instructor, St. Albert the Great, famously zinged back to the name-callers: "You call him the dumb ox, but in his teaching he will one day produce such a bellowing that it will be heard throughout the world." St. Albert was proved right! Aquinas was ordained a priest and went on to earn a doctorate; soon after, he became head of studies at the University of Paris. It was there that he wrote his seminal work, the "Summa Theologica," a systematic compilation of all-things theological. But as smart as Thomas was, he was also humble. Nearing the end of this work, Aquinas experienced a divine revelation. This revelation and experience of God was so profound that it made him realize that his many volumes and volumes of theological works were, in his words, just "so much straw" compared to the reality of God. He died less than a year later. But his works remain pivotal to the Church. And that ironically dubbed "Dumb Ox" remains, somewhat, the house theologian for the Catholic Church, and his works are required for study at all Catholic seminaries in the world. St. Thomas Aquinas is the Patron Saint of Catholic Schools and students.

January 31 – St. John Bosco, Priest: Okay, I have to confess, as a kid I thought there was a connection between St. John Bosco and the awesome Bosco Chocolate Syrup that you used to put in milk to make the most outrageously sweet chocolate milk in the universe. I thought, surely, he must have invented it – and they made him a saint because it was so dang good! Yeah, I loved Bosco. But I learned that I was wrong about the Bosco-connection. However, I also learned that St. John Bosco, like Bosco Chocolate Syrup, was a popular figure with the youth of his era. Here's his story: Following the death of his parent, John Bosco did magic tricks to raise money to support his family. After his performances, he would often repeat, to the boys who were a big part of his audience, what the Priest preached at Church that day, and he often managed to get their attention and keep them close to their faith. In 1841, John Bosco, answering God's call, was ordained a priest. In his ministry as a Priest, Fr. John Bosco worked intently with youth: he taught, he preached, he guided, and he befriended. He sought to find all different ways to keep young people close to the Church and to their faith. He set aside time for them to learn, pray and play. He founded the Salesians to educate boys and young men in the faith, and then founded the Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians to educate girls and young women. He was canonized in 1934 and is the Patron Saint of young people. While the chocolate delight of Bosco has gone the way of Betamax tapes, St. John Bosco hasn't. He still has an influence on our Church especially in its commitment to our youth and their faith lives. And it doesn't get sweeter than that!

So, as we enter this year's Catholic Schools Week, let's reflect on these great saints at the tail-end of January who, in living their lives of faith, promoted the knowledge and the love of Jesus Christ, whether in schools, in everyday life, or even on the Road to Damascus. St. Francis de Sales, St. Paul, St. Angela Merici, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. John Bosco, pray for us!
