

RECEIVING THE SACRAMENTS

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the office to register for Parent Pre-Baptismal Instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Education Office.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession).

Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Education Office. To request a visitation for Holy Communion to the Sick, contact our parish office.

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). Adults seeking Confirmation should contact our Religious Education Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, which is administered by a Priest, a person or an immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day.

- The addition of six golden candle sticks and new holders festooning the altar.


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

Do you think that I have learned anything from those experiences? Not really.

The fact is this. I was raised during an age when soda and Kool-Aid were the favorite beverages in the house. Water was an option for the thirsty folks. Nowadays water is the beverage of choice. I still haven't learned to drink the clear liquid with any real degree of regularity.

What it all comes down to is choice. I can make all kinds of excuses because I am trying my best to rationalize my choice to not drink water. Until it all catches up with me, and I am filled with resolve to do better. I buy myself a new and very attractive cup to heighten the appeal of the hydrogen/oxygen cocktail; it works for a while.

It has been said that, in life we are nothing but a sum of our choices. Everything comes down to choosing. Learning to make the right choices is not innate. We need guidance, direction, sometimes a little coercion works to teach the lesson of making a good choice. The worst part is in the making....sometimes other options seems so much more appealing and more fun.

We are at the speed of lightning fast approaching August 28, 2023. That happens to be a very significant date for more than just a few of my friends. It will be on the 28th day of the eighth month that those double doors will open wide to over three hundred fifty enthusiastic, and smartly dressed children. Many will be filled with a determination to make this a better year than last. To make better choices. Maybe it will be to get higher grades, or perhaps the tough choice might come with selecting friends, maybe the choice is to work as hard as last year, or maybe it's a choice to improve behavior at school. Ultimately, the choice is made by the child no matter the amount of counselling or direction provided. Sometimes students will find greater willpower to improve when they cross over into middle school. New building, new uniform, new schedule, new teachers...,what better time to adopt a new you?

The key to success lies in the amount of effort. The key to success lies in the amount of time dedicated to regularly planned review and reinforcement of information given during the school day. There is no slack time once school starts. There are other commitments, athletics, dance, gymnastics; a workable schedule to fit it all in has to be established early on. It's hard to keep all the plates spinning simultaneously. They are but children, after all.

So, one thing that always seems to help is establishing a routine. Imposing structure in the home, a set time for the evening meal, a set time for outdoor play following the school day, a set time for homework. A set time for studying. How many times has it been said with great glee that "there is no homework tonight!" Reading between the lines, the cheerful child simply means that there is no written homework. Well, that's great!! Now we have time to practice the spelling words, or read for twenty minutes, or review the Science notes, or practice a few of the Math problems you had difficulty with last week.

We all want our children to be successful. I have always been very proud of and admired the perseverance of our teachers in teaching their students the great value of a work ethic. It is a lesson that will see one through life. A work ethic defines a person. Plain and simple.

I include this week a list of tried-and-true practices in the formation of successful study habits.

- 1. DON'T ATTEMPT TO CRAM ALL OF YOUR STUDY TIME INTO ONE SESSION. Evenly spacing out shorter study sessions will typically aid in the retention of the material.
- 2. PLAN WHEN YOU ARE GOING TO STUDY. Successful students schedule specific times throughout the week when they are going to study -- and then they stick with their schedule.
- 3. EACH SESSION SHOULD HAVE A SPECIFIC, REALISTIC GOAL. For example, memorize the definitions of the first 10 geometry terms.
- 4. DON'T PROCRASTINATE IN GETTING THE STUDY SESSION STARTED. Stick to the schedule and then there is no cramming, no hurry. Make the right choice.....
- 5. BEGIN WITH THE MOST DIFFICULT SUBJECT FIRST. Mental energy is higher at the outset.
- 6. MINIMIZE DISTRACTIONS, find a good and comfortable space, give the phone over to mom or dad during study time. Make the best choice.....
- 7. STUDY GROUPS are also effective. Moral support, or a shared goal is never a bad thing.
- 8. MAKE USE OF WEEKEND TIME. Highly effective students realize the value of a little extra time.

Does it sound like a whole lot of fun? Maybe not, but the benefits of learned success are invaluable. Good habits formed early are lasting. Just be sure the habits are formed by the wise choices made.

- ♦ Renovations to the Rectory's kitchen, laundry room, hardwood floors, stairways in inside rectory area redone and carpeted.
- ♦ Added two restrooms in the narthex of the church and renovated the foyers to this area, school, and Parish Hall area.
- The confession schedule was expanded from its 4:00-4:50 pm before Mass on Saturday night to 8:30 am-10:00 am on Saturday morning with two priests after Mass (the number of people attending confession has grown tremendously).
- ♦ Mass schedule was adapted to reflect having two assigned priests instead of three.
- ♦ Began Holy Cross Novena before its Feast Day.
- ♦ Added handicapped electronic doors on Portico entrance to church.
- ♦ Moved Samaritan Food Pantry to Carriage House for more space and easier access.
- ♦ Security system installed including electronic locks and cameras to various buildings.
- ♦ New boiler in cafeteria which heats Parish Hall.
- New floors to back sacristy and sound room and new door to back sacristy.

Holy Cross School

- Has seen an increase in enrollment over the past few years.
- ♦ Began the practice of weekly Mass attendance by students on Wednesday mornings..
- ♦ Added a robotics lab and new media center.
- ♦ New improved music room for more space; art gallery in front lobby of school added.
- ♦ School chapel (in the Junior High building) was created.
- ♦ Instituted the use of Chrome Books for entire school.
- ♦ Establishment of a successful Pre-Kindergarten program for three-year olds.
- Wifi points added throughout the school property, along with the school and parish getting a new server, new wiring, new computers, and other new technologies (all maintained by a professional technology maintenance provider).
- ♦ VCRs and DVD players were replaced with classroom projectors and smart-boards.
- ♦ New roof on annex of school.
- New roof to gymnasium and added air conditioning to this much used space.

The Faithful of the Parish. There are many more small changes and improvements made in both parishes, but two significant items to mention are that Holy Cross remains the largest parish in the Diocese and Immaculate Conception (which has grown immensely) is one of the fastest growing parishes in the Diocese with Mass attendance up over 40% from 2014.

Hispanic Ministry. Another change that I made when I got here regards Hispanic Ministry — as Pastor I decided that there would not be a "designated" Spanish-speaking priest doing all the Spanish Masses and sacraments, but rather that ALL of our priests would have to learn some amount of Spanish and share in the mass rotation, treating the Spanish Mass like the other parishes masses. This allowed the full integration of Hispanic ministry into the Priestly ministry of the parish and parish life. Both Hispanic communities — Dover and Marydel — have grown substantially in these past 10 years.

Thank You All. I want to thank all of you — my dear parishioners — for your ongoing support of our two wonderful parishes here in the center of, and indeed in the heart of, the Delmarva peninsula. I thank you for ten years of leading two parishes that are so strongly committed to the practice of the Catholic faith, so powerfully pro-life, so devoted to our Blessed Mother and, above all, so faithful in following the ways of Christ.
