Sacrament of Baptism. Call the office to register for Parent Pre-Baptismal Instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Education Office.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession).

Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Education Office. To request a visitation for Holy Communion to the Sick, contact our parish office.

Before I get to the crux of this week's column (Part I of a two part column on the saint "14 Holy Helpers"), I want to deal with an issue arising here in Delaware regarding a life issue — or I should say, a life and death issue.

The Specter of Death. In Delaware we are again facing the specter of an assisted suicide bill — you know, another one of those laws that is designed to end a person's suffering by ending the person. Back in January, I wrote a column about the pernicious assisted suicide law in Canada that was enacted a few years back to address only the most serious terminal cases of suffering. That narrow band of eligible cases has widened in recent year to include mental health issues. That slippery slope in Canada provides for us in Delaware a cautionary tale on this matter.

The Slippery Slope. And of course, that slippery slope was pretty darn slippery. And in short order, with their assisted suicide law, Canada experienced — and mind you this is just a very small sampling of concerning matters —

Roger Foley of London, Ontario, age 42, who recorded two hospital staffers suggesting euthanasia to him as a remedy for the inadequate housing he was being offered for when he'd leave the hospital.

Alan Nichols of British Columbia who applied to be euthanized. His application for euthanasia listed only one health condition as the reason for his request to die: hearing loss. He received the requisite approvals, and he was put to death at a local hospital by lethal injection.

A Canadian veteran reported that a Veteran Affairs caseworker offered to him assisted suicide as an alternative to treatment for PTSD.

Another Canadian veteran was offered assisted suicide as an alternative in lieu of needing to get a wheelchair ramp.

In April 2022, two Canadian women applied to be euthanized because they could not find housing that was acceptable for their intolerance to smoke, air fresheners and cleansers. One has already be put to death.

Then there was 2021 case of Donna Duncan of British Columbia, who suffered from post concussion issues after a car accident, leading to depression. She requested assisted suicide and was approved for it, in lieu of other mental health treatment. She was put to death on October 29, 2021.

Euthanasia: The Activity Book. On top of this, the Canadian government has put out as medical assistance in dying children's "activity book" to explain about assisted suicide to youngsters. Described as being for children ages 6–12, in it, the child is taught how a person is killed

during euthanasia; it features writing prompts and drawing activities.

Regarding the Poor. On top of that, a 2021 poll found out that nearly 30% of Canadians approved of assisted suicide for a person whose only "affliction" was poverty. Nearly the same percentage approved of assisted suicide for a person whose only "affliction" was homelessness.

The Camel's Nose. Let's use Canada's experience as a cautionary tale. This is the door that will open in Delaware if an assisted suicide bill becomes law — forget the protections in the law, and the limitations asserted ... the very passage of the bill is the camel's nose under the tent, just as it was originally in Canada. Remember, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church wisely teaches: "It is God who remains the sovereign Master of life. We are obliged to accept life gratefully and preserve it for his honor and the salvation of our souls. We are stewards, not owners, of the life God has entrusted to us. It is not ours to dispose of." (#2280)

A Super Team: The 14 Holy Helpers. During difficult times people turn strongly to their faith. And one specific devotional path in prayer is to seek the intercession of a group of saints called "The 14 Holy Helpers," — most of whom were saints that had been martyrs in the early Church. The group of 14 Holy Helpers was to the faith, what The Avengers and The Justice League are to Marvel and DC Comics: a super team devoted to doing good. These 14 Holy Helpers were turned to, in prayer, by Catholics during times of great trial, stress and tribulation.

Helpers in Need. The devotion to this team of 14 saints, grouped as the Holy Helpers, started in Germany at the time of the great plague. In the German areas of Europe, these 14 were called the "Nothelfer," meaning "helpers in need." As the plague spread, devotion to the Holy Helpers also spread — not just in Europe, but later, throughout the world. It's connection to the plague faded in time, but the devotion to this powerful team of saintly intercessors did not. Ultimately, Pope Nicholas V affirmed this devotion granted to it special indulgences. In a Missal used at Mass in the late 15th century it stated:

"The Mass of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, approved by Pope Nicholas ... it is powerful on their behalf,



Every great song performer has a signature song. The first couple of notes arouse a memory of some sort, one where you just can't help but sing along. A little toe tapping, fingers just start snapping, maybe a little dancing in place...you are moved by the lyrics, by the melody. And, even though the song might be recorded by another artist, the memory of the first rendition lingers. For example, Hello Dolly! Who else but the great Satchmo! Right? New York, New York; it's been re-done by many. But; who else but Frank Sinatra could give it the style, the same... panache? Oddly enough I am not a real fan of either of these two artists, but I will always attribute those two songs to those two performers, because no one else can pull it off quite like they could.

Several years ago, our school Mass choir had a signature piece. *Christ Be Our Light*, (Bernadette Farrell, composer) was the name of the hymn and I recall the beautiful sounds produced by the harmonies, the lovely blending of soprano and alto voices just brought such a peace to the soul. I remember the graduates singing *Christ Be Our Light* at their graduation that year. The best part of that memory is that it was the graduate's idea to offer that gift of song to the congregation as a gesture of thanksgiving.

Christ, be our hope! Christ, be our purpose! Christ, be our vision, radiant and bright! Christ, be our Way, shatt'ring our blindness Gifting us with your sight! Christ, be our light! Shine in our hearts Shine through the darkness Christ, be our light! Shine in your church gathered today.

Last Friday we celebrated our last day of the school year with morning Mass. This Mass was a little different from our regularly scheduled weekly Mass because it was a school Mass. What does that mean? It means that only the school students and faculty were in attendance, along with a few parents. Our school Mass choir lead us in song and Mr. Michael Perza served as our accompanist. Our Pastor Father Lentini celebrated the Mass and delivered a thought-provoking homily in which he encouraged the students to "step up" to the challenges facing them in the next grade.

This past school year marked the first time where we literally took our show on the road. Proverbs 16:18 "Pride goes before the destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall." however so much one is in great illness or anguish or sadness, or in whatsoever tribulation a man shall be. It is powerful also on behalf of the imprisoned and detained, on behalf of merchants and pilgrims, for those that have been sentenced to die, for those who are at war, for women who are struggling in childbirth, or with a miscarriage, and for (the forgiveness of) sins, and for the dead."

A Deciquartet of Saints. The feast of the Holy Helpers (no longer on the Church calendar as a memorial or feast,) is still celebrated in some places, usually on August 8. The opening prayer for the Mass on the feast of 14 Holy Helpers names each member of this deciquartet (yes, I made that word up) of saintly intercessors:

"Almighty and merciful God, who didst adorn Thy Saints George, Blase, Erasmus, Pantaleon, Vitus, Christopher, Denis, Cyriacus, Acacius, Eustace, Giles, Margaret, Barbara and Catherine with special privileges above all others, so that all who in their necessities implore their help, according to the grace of Thy promise, may attain the salutary effect of their pleading, grant to us, we beseech Thee, forgiveness of our sins, and with their merits interceding, deliver us from all adversities, and kindly hear our prayers."

Fourteen Folks to Know. So, who are these 14 Holy Helpers whom I would commend that we should turn to in prayer during these tough times for the faithful? Well, some of them you may know already, and some are quite obscure. The following is a run down of this deciquartet (honestly, I think I'm going to get a trademark on that term) of saintly helpers who intercede for us in times trouble or need. These are the 14 Holy Helpers.

Saint George: Martyred under Roman Emperor Diocletian, he was a soldier in the Roman army. However, St. George got into a kerfuffle with the powers that be, when he refused to arrest Christians and offer sacrifices to Roman gods. He was cajoled and bribed to do so, but resisted. Ultimately, he was tortured and then executed for his offenses. He is a saint who is invoked against skin diseases and palsy.

Saint Blase: A side note, I love the way all word processors change this saints name from Blase to Blasé. And trust me, this saint is anything but blasé. But to appease my word processor, I will spell this saints name the traditional way: Blaise. End of problem. Another fourth century martyr, St. Blase was Bishop in Armenia during a time of Christian persecution, and was arrested for practicing his faith. While in prison, a mother with a son who had gotten a fishbone stuck in his throat visited St. Blase, who was her Bishop, and his blessing on her son. Upon blessing the boy, the bone dislodged and he was saved. The authorities continued to demand St. Blaise recant his faith in Christ; he refused. He was then tortured and beheaded for this offense. St. Blaise is invoked against diseases of the throat.

St. Erasmus: St. Erasmus (also known as St. Elmo, famously named in the title of the 80s brat-pack film "St. Elmo's Fire") was Bishop of Formia (half way between Rome and Naples). He served as a Bishop during the time of the Christian persecution led by the Roman Emperor Diocletian, in the early fourth century. For a while, he fled to Mount Lebanon to escape persecution; there, it is said, he was fed by a raven. He was found by the authorities and jailed, but he made multiple miraculous escapes with the help of an angel. He was tortured in the most brutal manner, and yet his wounds healed; he went on to die of natural causes (though deemed by the Church as a martyr by way of pious tradition). St. Erasmus is invoked by those suffering from stomach pains and disorders, and by women in labor.

The term St. Elmo's Fire which derives from St. Erasmus, in addition to being a movie, describes the meteorological condition of bright flashing lightning but which is illusory. Perhaps that is saintly irony, because the flashing power of this great saint is certainly bright, but certainly not illusory. St. Elmo's Fire — don't see the movie (it's pretty bad), but turn to the saint in prayer!

St. Pantaleon: Here we go again: St. Pantaleon is yet another early fourth century martyr persecuted under — you guessed it — Roman Emperor Diocletian. St. Pantaleon was the son of a rich pagan, but was raised a Christian by his mother with the help of a local priest. He went on to work as a physician to Emperor Maximinianus. Some nefarious peers revealed to the Emperor that St. Pantaleon was a Christian. The Emperor told St. Pantaleon he would be spared if he worshipped the pagan gods of Rome; he refused and was tortured. He was attempted to be put to death many times, but each time, he was rescued from death by Christ, who appeared to him in the form of a priest. Ultimately, after he was better prepared for his death, he was beheaded. He is invoked as a patron saint of physicians and midwives.

We'll stop here and pick up this column 14 Holy Helpers in the next bulletin, with the remaining 10 saints that compose the Holy Helpers.
