Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

In early 1979, I remember going to a New York City club and hearing an amazing rock band. They rocked with amazing guitar work, and rhythm. The name of the band – which was relatively unknown in the U.S. at that point – was Dire Straits. Within a few years, they would be major players in America's pantheon of rock'n'roll bands, reaching their apex in 1985 with their quasi-homage to MTV entitled, "Money for Nothing." But back in early 1979, they were relatively unheard of. I remember my friends and I really enjoyed their set, and the crowd (a fairly small one) raved at the end of the show. Their repertoire was so small back then that their third set was a repeat of their first set (with their soon-to-be first-hit "Sultans of Swing" as a centerpiece).

Band Aid? In any event, I told everyone and anyone who would listen, that this was an amazing band and that when their first album arrives, it would be worth a listen. I am sure other people who experienced that evening's performance did likewise. The good news of this great

band was spread and much interest was generated. And by the end of 1979, Dire Straits became a well-known band who first album sold over 2,000,000 copies. I'd like to think that my friends and I (and others who saw that first American appearance of the band) each had some small part in Dire Straits ensuing success. In some little way, our word-of-mouth praise, and our spreading interest and curiosity helped, perhaps, to create a buzz that made this unknown quantity, a known quantity.

A 40 Day Make Over. During this season of Lent, I would suggest that we need to create a buzz, not for some band, but rather for Jesus Christ; we need to make him known to others. But sometimes we can inadvertently stand in the way of that. How? You see, in Lent, there is often a tendency to re-ignite our faith, to draw ourselves closer to Lord and to turn back to God, seek his mercy and know his forgiveness. To borrow from Reality TV – in Lent we undergo a 40-day soul makeover. And that is a wonderful thing. As it says in Acts of the Apostles (3:19-20a), "*Repent, therefore, and be converted, that*

your sins may be wiped away, and that the Lord may grant you times of refreshment[.]" What's the problem with that, you may wonder? Nothing, unless we start to think of this conversion as just a matter between "me and God." But it cannot be that way with us; our personal spiritual renewal cannot be where the train stops.

Be Sunny and Share. Once we experience a strengthening in our Catholic faith and a renewal in Jesus Christ and his mercy and forgiveness, we can't just say "well, that's it I'm done." To put it back to my Dire Straits moment, if I had heard a wonderful band and not shared that with others, how selfish I would have been. It is a million times more selfish when the matter at hand is not a band, but rather our Lord, who gave us life and salvation. When we experience the goodness of God, learn of the power of forgiveness, and hear of the fullness of the truth that resides in the Catholic Church, how selfish it would be not to share that and make it known to others.

Charge! That is the call we each have this Lent: to not only recharge our spiritual batteries but also to recharge the spiritual batteries of others, so that all of us will be – dare I say – "ever-ready" to serve the Lord and love him more fully. St. Theresa Benedicta of the Cross said it well, "On the question of relating to our fellowman – our neighbor's spiritual need transcends every commandment." And my personal favorite saint, St. Thomas Aquinas, put it in even more clear and instructive terms: "To convert someone, go and take them by the hand and guide them."

Forward March! And so, as we continue our march through March in our journey of Lent, let us commit ourselves to making known to others, God's all-powerful presence in our world and our lives, and his great power of forgiveness and redemption, most especially through the awareness of Christ's Passion. To that end, our faith cannot be something we hide in the privacy of our home, or merely observe within the walls of a Church; rather it is something that we practice, live, and experience in our

daily lives. Our Catholic faith is something that we are obliged to share and spread, according to Christ's command: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15). We need to let those who walk in darkness, see the light of Christ and know the goodness of the Lord.

Keeping the Faith by Sharing It. St. Paul wrote, "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. So, we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God." (2 Corinthians 5:20-21). The word "ambassador" comes from the Latin, *ambactus*, meaning a servant or a messenger. We are Christ's ambassadors; we are the ones who serve God and make His message known to others. And so, this Lent, live your faith, strengthen your faith, and share your faith with those who don't know (or have forgotten) the Faith. This Lent, let "your light... shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." (Matthew 5:16).

Let me end on a cautionary note: If all we do in our faith life is limit our faith to "me and Thee," then we are not only distorting the call of our faith, but we are also limiting the reach of Christ in the world, and in our community, and in our families. And if that is how we dare choose to live our faith, then we are placing our souls in... dire straits.

So, this Lent, don't let your soul-makeover, be a sole makeover; help others to open their hearts and souls to Christ. Doing that will make this a most spiritually profitable season for our one, holy, Catholic, and apostolic Church, and make you a true ambassador for Christ.

COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO PADRE

JAMES LENTINI 19 DE MARZO, 2017.

Estimados feligreses,

A principios de 1979, recuerdo haber ido a un club nocturno de Nueva York y escuchar una banda de Rock fenomenal. Se movían con un ritmo y un toque de guitarra increíble. El nombre de la banda era Los Dire Straits. -que era relativamente desconocido en los Estados Unidos en ese tiempo- Dentro de unos cuantos años, su popularidad creció en el galardón de las bandas de Rock de Los Estados Unidos, llegando a su cima en 1985 con su homenaje a MTV titulado "Money for Nothing". Pero a principios de 1979 eran relativamente desconocidos. Recuerdo que mis amigos y yo realmente disfrutamos de su presentación, (una pequeña audiencia) elogiaron al final del espectáculo. Su repertorio era tan pequeño en ese entonces que su tercera presentación era una repetición de su primera (con su pronto-a-ser primer hit "Sultans of Swing" como pieza central).

¿ Banda Aid ? En cualquier evento, les dije a todos y a cualquiera que quisiera escuchar, que esta era una banda increíble y que cuando llegue su primer álbum, valdría la pena escucharlo. Estoy seguro de que otras personas que experimentaron el rendimiento de esa noche hicieron lo mismo. La buena noticia de esta gran banda se difundió y generó mucho interés. Y a finales de 1979, Dire Straits se convirtió en una banda muy conocida cuyo primer álbum vendió más de 2,000,000 de copias. Me gustaría pensar que mis amigos y yo (y otros que vieron esa primera aparición americana de la banda) cada uno tuvo una pequeña parte en Dire Straits éxito. De alguna manera, nuestro elogio de boca en boca, y nuestro creciente interés y curiosidad ayudaron, tal vez, a crear un zumbido que hizo esta cantidad desconocida, a una cantidad conocida

40 Días de Cambio. Durante este Tiempo de Cuaresma, sugeriría que necesitamos crear un zumbido, no para alguna banda, sino más bien para Jesucristo; Tenemos que darle a conocer a los demás. Pero a veces nos quedamos inadvertidamente cortos, y nos ponemos en el camino de eso. ¿Cómo? Ves, en Cuaresma, a menudo hay una tendencia a volver a encender la llama de nuestra fe, a acercarnos al Señor y a volvernos a Dios, buscar su misericordia y conocer su perdón. Para tomar prestado de Reality TV - en Cuaresma hacemos un cambio de imagen de 40 días. Y eso es algo maravilloso. Como dice en Hechos de los Apóstoles (3: 19-20a): *" Arrepiéntanse, pues, y conviértanse, para que les sean borrados sus pecados. Así el Señor hará llegar el tiempo del alivio"*. Puede preguntarse ¿Cuál es el problema? Con eso, Nada, a menos que comencemos a pensar en esta conversión como un asunto entre " Dios y yo ". Pero no puede ser así con nosotros; Nuestra renovación espiritual como persona no puede ser donde el tren se detiene.

Brilla y Comparta. Una vez que experimentamos un fortalecimiento en nuestra fe Católica y una renovación en Jesucristo, su

misericordia y su perdón, no podemos simplemente decir "bien, esto es todo ya terminé." Para ponerlo de nuevo en mi momento de Dire Straits, si yo hubiera oído una banda maravillosa y no lo hubiera compartido con los demás, hubiera sido bien egoísta. Es un millón de veces más egoísta cuando el asunto que nos ocupa no es una banda, sino más bien nuestro Señor, que nos dio la vida y la salvación. Cuando experimentamos la bondad de Dios, aprendemos del poder del perdón y escuchamos de la plenitud de la verdad que reside en la Iglesia Católica, cuán egoísta sería no compartirla y darlo a conocer a otros.

iCargar! Esto es el llamado que cada uno de nosotros tiene esta Cuaresma: no sólo para recargar nuestras baterías espirituales, sino también para recargar las baterías espirituales de los demás, para que todos nosotros - me atrevo a decir -estemos "siempre listo" para servir al Señor y amarlo plenamente. Santa Teresa Benedicta de la Cruz lo decía muy bien: "Sobre la pregunta que tiene que ver con nuestra relación con nuestro prójimo -la necesidad espiritual de nuestro prójimo trasciende todo mandamiento". Y mi santo favorito, Santo Tomás de Aquino, lo puso en términos aún más claros e instructivos: " Para convertir a alguien, ve y tómallo por la mano y guíalo."

i Marzo Avanza! Y así, a medida que continuamos nuestra marcha por el mes de marzo en nuestra jornada Cuaresmal, nos comprometemos de dar a conocer a otros, la presencia omnipotente de Dios en nuestro mundo y en nuestras vidas, y su gran poder de perdón y redención, La conciencia de la Pasión de Cristo. Para ello, nuestra fe no puede ser algo que escondemos en la intimidad de nuestra casa, o simplemente observamos dentro de los muros de una Iglesia; Sino que es algo que practicamos, vivimos y experimentamos en nuestra vida cotidiana. Nuestra fe católica es algo que estamos obligados a compartir y difundir, según el mandato de Cristo: "Vayan por todo el mundo y proclamen el Evangelio a toda criatura" (Marcos 16:15). Necesitamos dejar que los que andan en tinieblas, ven la luz de Cristo y conozcan la bondad del Señor.

Mantener la Fe Compartiéndola. San Pablo escribió: " Pues en Cristo Dios estaba reconciliando el mundo con él; ya no tomaba en cuenta los pecados de los hombres, sino que a nosotros nos entregaba el mensaje de la reconciliación. Nos presentamos, pues, como embajadores de Cristo, como si Dios mismo les exhortara por nuestra boca. En nombre de Cristo les rogamos: idéjense reconciliar con Dios! Dios hizo cargar con nuestro pecado al que no cometió pecado, para que así nosotros participáramos en él de la justicia y perfección de Dios."(2 Corintios 5: 20-21). La palabra "embajador" viene del latín, ambactus, que significa siervo o mensajero. Somos embajadores de Cristo; Nosotros somos los que servimos a Dios y hacemos conocer su mensaje a los demás. Por lo tanto, esta Cuaresma, vive tu fe, fortalece tu fe y comparte tu fe con aquellos que no la conocen (o han olvidado) la Fe. Esta Cuaresma, " Hagan, pues, que brille su luz ante los hombres; que

vean estas buenas obras, y por ello den gloria al Padre de ustedes que está en los Cielos." (Mateo 5:16).

Permítanme terminar con una nota de advertencia: Si todo lo que hacemos en nuestra vida de fe, es limitarnos nuestra fe a " Tú y yo ", entonces no sólo estamos distorsionando el llamado de nuestra fe, sino que también estamos limitando el alcance de Cristo en la Mundo, en nuestra comunidad, y en nuestras familias. Y si es así como nos atrevemos a decidir vivir nuestra fe, entonces estamos poniendo nuestras almas en... apuros.

Por lo tanto, esta Cuaresma, no deje que tu cambio del alma, sea solo un cambio de imagen; Ayuda a otros a abrir sus corazones y almas a Cristo. Al hacer esto hará que este tiempo sea un tiempo espiritualmente más provechosa para nuestra santa iglesia, católica y apostólica, y que seas un verdadero embajador para Cristo.
