Dear Parishioners,

An always prevalent sign of fall beginning in the mid-Atlantic area is that it is no longer possible to have a hot dog at Phillies game (that change over usually begins around October 1). But in spite of the Phillies lack of post-season action, fall is an incredible and beautiful time of the year — and all we have to do is sit back and enjoy it! It happens autumn-atically! For us in Delaware, this weekend usually marks the end of the late-summer season for beach traffic and the start of being able to use Route 1 in a non-stressful way again. What event marks this demarcation? Usually, it is the advent of the Columbus Day weekend. And in this column, I want to write a little about Christopher Columbus.

A Map Quest. Christopher Columbus is an important, and at times, a controversial figure in world history — and his holiday observance for us, marks more than just a change in temperature. Columbus was an intently Christian man of his era, and his faith informed much of what he did. For

example, when planning for his voyage to “the new world” he used information from the Biblical book of Nehemiah for his computations to get from Portugal to Cipangu (Japan). In this, Columbus gets an A for effort, but an F for usable navigation... and we know he wound up far from his intended destination.

Eastside, Westside. Faith formed much of the way Columbus lived and led. It is posited that Columbus, unlike many sailors of his day, never used vulgarity or curse words. Likewise, he and his crew prayed vespers (evening prayer) each night of the voyage, and used acclamations about Jesus and Mary at the top and bottom of each hour, as they timed their journey. Then, in October of 1492, upon reaching the West Indies, which he thought were the East Indies, Columbus initiated the process of that would lead to the conversion of half of the world to our Savior Jesus Christ.

The Reign in Spain. Within 40 years of his arrival in “the new world,” the Spanish crown began a colonization of the

new world that not only brought the Spanish language to an area stretching from the US southeast and southwest, through much of the Caribbean, and throughout most of Central and South America, but also brought the Catholic faith. By the 1530s, over 5,000,000 Indians in Mexico were baptized, the Franciscan order began to set up Churches and monasteries in this new land, and from then and until late 19th century, Spain sent over 15,000 missionaries to evangelize the new world. [Note: The Spanish influence stuck: Spanish is the main language of nearly all of Central America (sans Belize), and nearly all of South America (sans Brazil and the Guianas). It is likewise the second most spoken language in the USA.] Likewise, Columbus' Catholic faith can be seen in the names of many "Saint"-named Islands of the Caribbean, as well as in the naming of Trinidad (meaning Trinity) and the Virgin Islands (honoring the 11,000+ virgins martyred along with St. Ursula back in the day).

As a result of Columbus' bringing the truth of Jesus Christ to half of the earth that had not yet been evangelized, he started the process of developing a fully Christian western hemisphere, with Catholicism as its largest single religion. Columbus (an Italian from Genoa, who was financed by Spain, and sailed from Portugal) also opened the path for Brazil to be colonized by the Portuguese Empire, and allowing it to become the most populous Catholic nation on earth.

Another St. Christopher? And all of this started with Christopher Columbus. His efforts, were so crucial to the spread of the Gospel, that there was a move over the centuries to have him canonized as a saint. In the 19th century this movement reached its peak, finding favor with Pope Pius IX. However, upon examination of his life, it was found that Christopher Columbus had fathered a child out of wedlock, and that there was a lack of the required miracle attributable to him. Thus, his cause ran onto the rocks.

Knight Shift. Later in our American Catholic history, in the late 19th century, a Priest named Fr. Michael McGivney

organized a new Catholic men's fraternal group called The Knights of Columbus. Why Columbus? According to past Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson, writing on the 500th anniversary of Columbus' death in 2006, "*[C]olumbus ... opened the Americas to Christianity, and we pause to remember why it is that we bear his name. At the time of our Orders founding, anti-Catholic sentiment in the United States continued to marginalize Catholics and Catholic immigrants simply because of their faith. As a result, in 1882, our founder, Father Michael J. McGivney... chose the name Knights of Columbus because the explorer was a Catholic who was nonetheless universally regarded as a national hero. By taking the name of Columbus, the Knights were able to remind the entire country of the Catholic roots of the New World, and to highlight the fact that faithful Catholics could also be good citizens[.]*"

Monday, Monday. In much of Latin American there are, and have been for years, observances for Columbus; the United States came late to this holiday. In 1905, Colorado became the first state to institute Columbus Day, but by 1937, thanks to the lobbying of the Knights of Columbus, October 12, as Columbus Day became and remains a federal holiday (though now observed on a Monday). And so, on this Columbus Day weekend, regardless of what one thinks of the life of Christopher Columbus, the man, we should remind ourselves that his actions helped make a separated world, closer, and ultimately brought the Gospel to millions in the Americas.

Christ said: "*Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.*" Today, let's remind ourselves of the call to spread the Good News; in whatever waters we sail in life, and wherever we find ourselves, as faithful Catholics, we must always bring Christ with us and make him known to others!



COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO PADRE JAMES LENTINI 8 DE OCTUBRE, 2017.

Estimados feligreses,

Un signo siempre prevalente de que el Otoño comienza en el área del medio Atlántico es que ya no es posible conseguir un perro caliente (Hot Dog) en el juego de Los Phillies (ese cambio generalmente empieza alrededor del 1 de octubre). Pero a pesar de que los Phillies no estarán en la acción de post-temporada, el Otoño es una tiempo del año increíblemente hermoso - y todo lo que tenemos que hacer es sentarnos admirar y disfrutar! Para nosotros en Delaware, este fin de semana por lo general marca el final de la temporada de verano para el tráfico de la playa y el comienzo nuevamente de poder usar la ruta 1 de una manera no estresante. ¿Qué evento marca esta demarcación? Por lo general, es el advenimiento del fin de semana del Día de Colón. Y en esta columna, quiero escribir un poco sobre Cristóbal Colón.

Un Map Quest. Cristóbal Colón es una figura importante y, a veces, controversial en la historia del mundo - y su día feriado marca más que un cambio de temperatura para nosotros. Colón era un hombre de su época, intensamente cristiano y su fe dice mucho de lo que hizo. Por ejemplo, al planear su viaje al "nuevo mundo" utilizó información del libro bíblico de Nehemías para sus cálculos para llegar de Portugal a Cipangu (Japón). En esto, Colón obtiene un **A** por esfuerzo, pero un **F** por navegación utilizable... y sabemos que terminó lejos de su destino.

Este, a Oeste. La fe se formó en gran parte por la forma en que vivió y actuó Colón. Se postula que Colón, a diferencia de muchos otros marineros de su época, nunca usó palabras vulgares o maldijo. Igualmente, él y su equipo oraban vísperas (oración vespertina) cada noche del viaje, y usaban aclamaciones sobre Jesús y María en la parte superior e inferior de cada hora, a medida que ellos cronometraron su viaje. Luego, en octubre de 1492, al llegar a las Indias Occidentales, que él pensaba que eran las Indias Orientales, Colón inició el proceso que conduciría a la conversión de la mitad del mundo a nuestro Salvador Jesucristo.

El Reino en España. A los 40 años de su llegada al "nuevo mundo", la corona española comenzó una colonización del nuevo mundo que no sólo trajo el idioma español a un área que se extiende desde el suroeste y sureste de los Estados Unidos, y gran parte del Caribe, de Sur y Centro América, pero también trajo la fe católica. En la década de 1530, más de 5,000,000 de indios en México fueron bautizados, la orden franciscana comenzó a establecer iglesias y monasterios en esta nueva tierra, y desde entonces y hasta finales del siglo XIX, España envió más de 15,000 misioneros para evangelizar el nuevo mundo. [Nota: La influencia española pegó: el español es el idioma principal de casi toda América Central (con la excepción de Belice), y casi toda América del Sur (excepto de Brasil y las Guayanas). De la misma manera, la fe católica de Colón se puede ver en los nombres de muchas islas "Santo" del Caribe, así como en el nombre de Trinidad (que significa

la Santísima Trinidad) y las Islas Vírgenes (en honor a las 11,000 vírgenes martirizadas junto con Santa Úrsula en tiempos atrás).

Como resultado de que Colón 'trajo la verdad de Jesucristo a la mitad del orbe que aún no había sido evangelizada, comenzó el proceso de desarrollo de un hemisferio occidental completamente cristiano, con el catolicismo como la única y mayor religión. Colón (un italiano de Génova, que fue financiado por España, y navegó desde Portugal) también abrió el camino para que Brasil fuera colonizado por el Imperio portugués, y permitiéndolo convertirse en la nación católica más populosa del planeta

¿Otro San Cristóbal? Y todo esto comenzó con Cristóbal Colón. Sus esfuerzos fueron tan cruciales para la difusión del Evangelio, que hubo un movimiento a través de los siglos para tenerlo canonizado como un santo. En el siglo XIX este movimiento tuvo un gran auge, encontrando favor con el Papa Pío IX. Sin embargo, al examinar su vida, se encontró que Cristóbal Colón había engendrado a un niño fuera del matrimonio, y que había una falta del milagro requerido atribuible a él. Así, su causa corrió sobre las rocas.

Cambio de Caballero. Más tarde, en nuestra historia católica americana, a finales del siglo XIX, un sacerdote llamado Fr. Michael McGivney organizó un nuevo grupo fraternal de hombres católicos llamado Los Caballeros de Colón. ¿Por qué Colón? Según el pasado Caballero Supremo Carl A. Anderson, escribiendo sobre el quincuagésimo aniversario de la muerte de Colón en 2006, "Colón... abrió las Américas al cristianismo, y nos detenemos a recordar por qué es que llevamos su nombre. En el momento de nuestra fundación de las órdenes, el sentimiento anticatólico en los Estados Unidos siguió marginando a los católicos ya los inmigrantes católicos simplemente por su fe. Como resultado, en 1882, nuestro fundador, el Padre Michael J. McGivney ... escogió el nombre de Caballeros de Colón porque el explorador era un católico que sin embargo era universalmente considerado como un héroe nacional. Tomando el nombre de Colón, los Caballeros pudieron recordar a todo el país las raíces católicas del Nuevo Mundo y destacar el hecho de que los fieles católicos también podrían ser buenos ciudadanos [.] "

Lunes, Lunes. En gran parte de América Latina hay, ha habido durante años, observancias para el día de Colón; los Estados Unidos vino más tarde la fiesta. En 1905, Colorado se convirtió en el primer estado en instituir el Día de Colón, pero en 1937, gracias al cabildeo de los Caballeros de Colón, el 12 de octubre, es cuando el Día de Colón se convirtió y sigue siendo un feriado federal. Y así, en este fin de semana del Día de Colón, sin importar lo que se piense de la vida de Cristóbal Colón, el hombre, debemos recordar que sus acciones ayudaron a hacer un mundo diferente, más cercano y, finalmente, trajo el Evangelio a millones en las Américas.

Cristo dijo: "Id, pues, y haced discípulos de todas las naciones, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo, enseñándoles a guardar todo lo que yo

os he mandado". Recordemos el llamado a difundir la Buena Nueva; en las aguas que naveguemos en la vida, y dondequiera que nos encontremos, como fieles católicos, debemos siempre traer a Cristo con nosotros y darlo a conocer a los demás.
