

## RECEIVING THE SACRAMENTS

*The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.*

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the office to register for Parent Pre-Baptismal Instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Education Office.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Education Office. To request a visitation for Holy Communion to the Sick, contact our parish office.

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). Adults seeking Confirmation should contact our Religious Education Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, which is administered by a Priest, a person or an immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day.

Dear Parishioners,

**Before we start this column, I want to make note that we have begun the multi-week change of having all Holy Cross weekday Masses, funerals, and confession times held at Immaculate Conception Church in Marydel. This is being done due to the roof replacement being done at Holy Cross. I want to thank the members of Holy Cross for their patience during this time of construction and I want thank the kind folks of Immaculate Conception Parish for being so welcoming to our displaced Holy Cross Parishioners. I thank everyone for their patience and understanding during this time!**

With the Feast of the Archangels coming up on Thursday (Sept. 29) and the Memorial of the Guardian Angels on October 2, I thought I prepare, at least allegorically, a little angel food cake for you all in this week's and next week's column. Let's talk about angels!

**A Capra-icious Assertion.** Movie Director Frank Capra was a bad guy... well, at least when it came to educating people about angels. I am sure most of you have seen Capra's seminal movie "It's a Wonderful Life" in which all of mankind learns that "Every time a bell rings, an angel gets it wings." That capriciously asserted bit of angel lore combined with various movies, TV shows and songs about angels have given us a skewed understanding of who or what an angel is. Heck, when I hear the word "Angel" I sometimes think of Farrah Fawcett, Kate Jackson and Jaclyn Smith (from "Charlie's Angels") but I don't mix them up with God's angels.

**Angelic Basics.** Let start with the basics: in God's creation -- at least as it has been revealed to us -- there are two types of beings with free will: humans and angels. As St. Thomas Aquinas might have posited in scholastic terms: Men and angels are not just different in degree they are different in kind. They are not up vs. down, in vs. out, tall vs. short -- they are aardvark vs. cashews. They are different in what they are. That is to say, men are not angels, angels are not men, nor can one ever become the other. To wit, angels are created by God in the supernatural realm (the invisible or spiritual realm), while men are created by God in the natural realm (the visible or physical realm). If a human being moves from the natural realm to the supernatural realm of heaven (as opposed to the other place), he becomes a saint, not an angel. If an angel falls from the realm of glory, as, for example, the angel Lucifer did, he becomes a "fallen angel" or "demon." Man can become neither a demon nor an angel -- as it is neither who, nor what, we were created to be. A human being's essence is that of a human person with a human

nature, an angelic being's essence is that of an angelic personage and an angelic nature.

**He's an Angel?** So, if you are at a funeral and you hear someone say "Uncle Luigi was a good man, but God took him home to be one of his angels," please realize that what that person said is theologically wrong. What that person put forth serves to diminish God's perfections (i.e., the person is saying that God didn't mean to make Uncle Luigi a human in the first place) as well as Luigi's humanity (i.e., human life has dignity and worth endowed by God -- it is who we are now and forever). Of course, when people say things like "Uncle Luigi is now an angel in heaven," they say it in a well-meaning moment of emotion; however, even the deepest felt emotion has to reach its end at the door of truth -- men do not become angels... ever. When the Penguins sang the 1958 hit, "Earth Angel, Earth Angel, won't you be mine" little did they know they made a great song but a greater error in theology.

**Knowing No-Wing.** Okay, then, you might ask, "What are angels if they are not good men and women attaining heavenly wings?" Let's start by plucking the angelic wings: angels don't have wings in the physical sense... angels are purely spiritual beings. They are from the realm of supernatural (the non-physical world). The Church holds that angels have appeared to mankind at different moments in history -- but those visible appearances are rare, and they are visions: They are the human mind attempting to put sight to that which is of the supernatural realm. In our human senses we cannot see angels as they are. While they may appear to us in some discernable form to be comprehensible, as Gabriel appeared to Mary, in their true form they are spiritual, not physical beings. So, how have people understood what an angel "looks like?" Mainly through artists who knew that angels -- at least the kind that draw near earth -- were God's messengers speaking his truth to us. Since they had this image of angels coming through the heavens to us, artists gave them wings to help us, in our human senses, to understand them better.

**Lofty Choirs.** Now, above I mentioned "angels -- at least the kind that draw near earth -- are God's messengers." You may wonder: are there any other kinds of angels? Yes, there are. There are nine ranks or choirs of angels -- each with a

different purpose as created by God. You may have heard of some of these other angels at Mass, without even realizing that angels were being spoken about.

With that background, let us examine those nine choirs (types) of angels. Let's start by understanding the proper "order" for these angels. Angels are ranked, so to speak, highest to lowest, based on their understood proximity to God. Think of it like a medieval king's court – the people most important are those sitting closest to the king. And so, too, it is with angels. The higher ranked choirs are those closest to Him and His throne, and they are grouped in threes:

### **Group 1: Angels of the Heavenly Court**

**1. Seraphim.** The Seraphim are, as the 1960s song might put it, the leaders of the packs. These angels are the guardians that are astride God's holy throne in heaven. At Mass when we say "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts" we are imitating the words which the Seraphim use to praise God around his holy throne, as noted in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah 6:1-7. Impressing even the Buffalo Wild Wings and KFC crowd, according to Scripture, the Seraphim have six wings (two cover their face, two cover their feet and two are for flying). Here is how the Prophet Isaiah describes his encounter with the Seraphim when he was called by God to preach his word, and was worried that as he had sinned in his speech during his life, he might not be the one to speak for God:

*In the year King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple. Seraphim were stationed above; each of them had six wings: with two they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they hovered. One cried out to the other: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" ... Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding an ember which he had taken with tongs from the altar. He touched my mouth with it. "See," he said, "now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged." (Isaiah 6:1-3, 6-7)*

**2. Cherubim.** The Cherubim (a.k.a. Cherubs) are the second of the nine choirs of angels. Most people don't like being called two-faced but imagine having four faces! The Cherubim do... they have the faces of a man, an ox, a lion and an eagle. While the Seraphim have six wings, the Cherubim only have four, but their wings are also covered with eyes (I guess if God is the teacher, they are the pupils). The Cherubim are guard-like (though not guardian) angels. Thus, we are told that they stand guard as heavenly attendants to God, endlessly praising Him. Similarly, in Genesis, the Cherubim stand guard at the way to the tree of life: *"The Lord God therefore banished him from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from which he had been taken. He expelled the man, stationing the cherubim and the fiery revolving sword east of the garden of Eden, to guard the way to the tree of life." (Genesis 3:23-24)*

**3. Thrones.** The Thrones are like the gateway to see the Big Guy... no lower ranked angel (#4-9) gets to stand before God, unless the Thrones – doing the will of God – let them in. The Thrones and some of the lower angel choirs are referenced in Colossians 1:16, *"For in Him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through Him and for Him."* These references, which many might take to be earthly political descriptions, are actually references to types of angels.

**To Be Continued.** The final six types of angels, in their two choirs, will be explained in next week pastor's column. And we enter into October very soon, I commend you during that tenth month of the year to heed the message of God's angels, to pray the rosary, and to respect life! God bless you all!
